These days, it seems the world at large deems it politically incorrect to talk about hell. Having seemingly defined the character of God to fit their notion that He would neither create a place of eternal torment nor send anyone there, many choose to simply ignore what the Bible says about hell. Yet, would it surprise you to learn that the Bible contains more verses about hell than it does about heaven? Today's song on "Cross Connection" has been described as "cautionary". Let's consider the lyrics, and look at what the Bible says!

### The Song <sup>1</sup>

- Title cut from 1976 album by Eddie Kendricks
- Describes God's plans:
  - Judgment for a sin-filled world
  - For salvation through faith in Jesus Christ



### The Artist – Edward James Kendrick, a.k.a., Eddie Kendricks <sup>1</sup>

- American tenor singer and songwriter from Alabama; lived 1939-1992
- Noted for distinctive falsetto singing style
- Began singing with his best friend Paul Williams in their church choir in late 1940s
  - Formed doo-wop group (*The Cavaliers*) in Birmingham in '55
  - Moved to Cleveland, then to Detroit; performing as *The Primes* and *The Elgins*
- Co-founded the Motown singing group *The Temptations* in '61
  - Sang lead until 1971, on such hits as "The Way You Do The Things You Do", "Get Ready", "Just My Imagination", "I'm Gonna Make You Love Me" (with the *Supremes*)
- As a solo artist, recorded several hits during '70s, including the #1 "Keep On Truckin'"
  - Other hits include "Boogie Down" (#2), "Son of Sagittarius" (#28), "Shoeshine Boy" (#18), and "He's a Friend" (#36)
  - Also sang with David Ruffin, and Hall and Oates in the mid-1980s
- With the *Temptations*, was voted into Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1989
- Ironically, he was a chain smoker who passed away as a result of lung cancer in 1992

### Final Thoughts: <sup>3</sup>



#### How could a God of love possibly send people to such a place as hell? <sup>3</sup>

The ideas of *love* and *hell* seem to be opposites. Some people solve the problem by saying there is no such place as hell. Everyone, according to them, will go to Heaven - even Hitler.

But Christ taught very plainly that hell exists, that it is eternal torment and punishment, and that all who reject God's free forgiveness will have to endure it.

Do we really think that a God of love has no right to punish us for our sin?

Why can't God open Heaven to everyone?

Because He is *holy* - He is *perfect*. We, on the other hand, are full of pride, greed selfishness and callousness. We are full of back-biting, whispering, gossiping, cheating and lying; not to mention sensual deeds and thoughts. He hates sin and will never tolerate or co-exist with it.

If Heaven were to be opened to us without our having to repent and be converted, then it would immediately cease to be Heaven.

The pain of the nails through His hands and feet was nothing by comparison with the weight of agony and torment He felt in His soul, as God the Father placed upon Him the punishment due to all those who would one day be forgiven.

When we ask, 'How can a God of love send people to hell?' we must never forget that God's amazing, unfathomable love is shown in the lengths to which He was prepared to go to deliver us from the just punishment of our sin. Jesus died for you. Will you recognize your sinful condition, ask Him for forgiveness, and accept the price He paid for you?
