Program 10 – "Jesus Is Just Alright" © 1969 Arthur Reid Reynolds

In light of the great success the Doobie Brothers had with this song (#35 on the Billboard Pop Charts in February 1973), some may be surprised to learn that "Jesus Is Just Alright" was first recorded in 1969 by The Byrds. That version barely edged into the US charts, peaking at #97. The song was also recorded by the Christian group DC Talk in 1992. The Doobie Brothers' version remains popular on classic rock radio stations today (source: Wikipedia). The timing was right, as the Jesus Movement emerged during the late '60s and early '70s, and the song's message resonated with a generation searching for spiritual truth.

- Speaks of a personal relationship with Jesus
- An old hymn from the Civil War era testifies -- "He leadeth me, He leadeth me. By His own hand He leadeth me"

- Are we willing to be led by the Lord, or are we still tenaciously clinging to the steering wheel?

Legendary country music star, Johnny Cash, knew there is a social price for taking a stand for Jesus. Cash once said,

"Being a Christian isn't for sissies. It takes a real man to live for God—a lot more man than to live for the devil, you know? If you really want to live right these days, you gotta be tough."

Cash was intimately aware of the hard truths about living God's way. He also noted,

"If you're going to be a Christian, you're going to change. You're going to lose some old friends, not because you want to, but because you need to".
