Program 16 – “Oh Happy Day”

In 1969, the Edwin Hawkins Singers took this adapted hymn all the way to #4 on the US pop charts, and #2 in Britain. “Oh Happy Day” became the first of its type -- a gospel hymn crossing over to hit the pop charts¹ It happened at least one more time when Judy Collins’ a capella recording of “Amazing Grace” spent 67 weeks on the chart from 1970-1972, and peaked at #5.² Today we refer to Edwin Hawkins’ rendition of the song as an “Ultimate Oldie”, but just consider that the original “O Happy Day” hymn was written 250+ years ago!

The song’s author, Philip Doddridge, was born in London in 1702 – the 20th child of his parents. He was only one of two that survived infancy. It’s been noted that -- that fact alone ‘is enough to make anyone famous, without anything else’. Like Charles Wesley, who was the last of a mere 18 live births and Doddridge’s junior by 5 years, Philip was so small and silent that his parents thought him stillborn. Both became hugely-successful hymn-writers.³

At the age of seven, Edwin Hawkins was already the keyboardist for his family’s gospel choir. With this hit song, Grammy-winner Hawkins distinguished himself as one of the originators of the urban contemporary gospel sound. The Edwin Hawkins Singers are less well-known for backing Melanie on the song, “Lay Down (Candles in the Rain)”.

- Recorded by the *Northern California State Youth Choir* on their 4th album
 - San Francisco Bay area DJs started this song from that album; popularity spread
 - Oh Happy Day features the lead vocal of Dorothy Coombs Morrison
 - Song was also recorded by the Four Seasons

“Oh Happy Day” was controversial when released. A group of local pastors petitioned to have it pulled from rock radio, and many Christians criticized the group for performing in mainstream venues.

“We thought, *Why would we just spend our lives singing to each other?*” Hawkins says. “Those that don’t know Jesus are the ones we should be singing to and telling about Jesus Christ...I think that it’s not just the song, but the gospel itself that transcends all racial barriers, language barriers, all of that,” he says.⁵
